




We created Empathy Maps and looked for commonalities . . .

ICS





What is ICS

- Standardized, on-scene, all-hazards incident management concept
- Enables a coordinated response between multiple organizations
- Establishes common processes and common language for management of resources
- Allows for integration within a common organizational structure







ICS Concepts

- Organizational Structure (Chain of Command)
- Span of Control
- Accountability of Resources (Occupants as Well)
- Multi-Agency Communication
- Common Terminology







Incident or Event?















- Can stay calm during emergency situations
- Can "size-up" the situation and make rapid decision-(right or wrong)
- Communicate clear directions and lead a team
- Be flexible to change if current operations are not working

Operational Considerations

- How to conduct a "Size Up" of the incident or event
- Liaison with Emergency Responders
- Emergency Operations Planning
- ICS in Event Planning and Exercise
- Resources for the "Next Steps" of Training







Size-Up

- SITUATIONAL AWARENESS
- What has occurred?
- What is the current status of the emergency?
- Is there anyone injured or trapped?
- What resources do we need?
- Does the emergency fall within my scope of training?







Emergency Responders

- Who is the Incident Commander?
- Where is the Incident Command Post?
- How do I effectively Liaison with the IC?
- What communication tools do they use?
- What resources will I need?







Emergency Operations Plans

- Integrating ICS concepts into the EOP's under Command and Control
- Think about facilities and best practices for door numbering, etc.
- Think about your communications systems
- What future training would you like "Key Personnel" to have?







Event Planning and Exercise

- Integrating ICS concepts into your current planned events.
- Complete documentation of the event using an Incident Action Plan.
- Communicate with your responders any large event planning.
- It's a great first step to getting personnel to utilize the components of the system.
